

3, Ray Gordon Garvie well and truly serve our Sovereign Lord the King in the Australian Imperial Force from 19 h au a 1914 until the end of the War, and a further period of four months thereafter unless sooner lawfully discharged, dismissed, or removed therefrom; and that I will resist His Majesty's enemies and cause His Majesty's peace to be kept and maintained; and that I will in all matters appertaining to my service, faithfully discharge my duty according to law.
